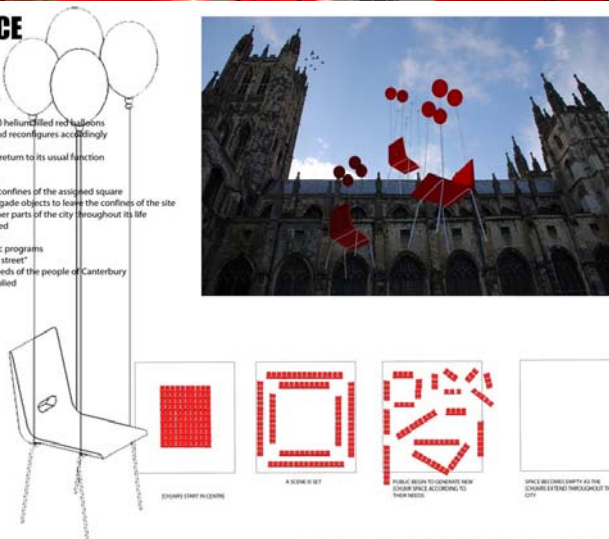
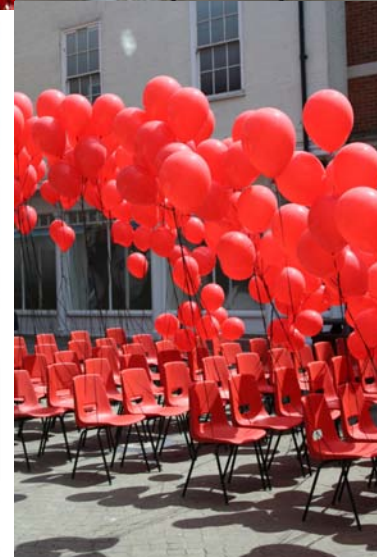




CH_AIR SPACE

Lee Evans Partnership worked with a team of students from Canterbury School of Architecture at the University College for Creative Arts to create a unique street installation in Longmarket, right in the centre of Canterbury's main high street.

The event was just one of several organised by RIBA SE Canterbury Branch for Architecture08. The students mission was to involve the public in Architecture08, and to inspire them to think more creatively about architecture and the space around them.

Their dynamic concept CH_AIR SPACE which involved no less than 400 helium balloons and 100 red chairs did just this as the students reconfigured the initial assigned square set up in Longmarket and moved the installation in different formations through Canterbury.
