Neville Childhood Epilepsy Centre LABC South East Building Excellence Award Winner 14/06/10

The Neville Childhood Epilepsy Centre, beat off strong competition to win the LABC South East Building Excellence Award in the Best Community Development category. The new centre was designed by Lee Evans Partnership LLP and built by Buxton Building Contractors Ltd for The National Centre for Young People with Epilepsy (NCYPE) in Lingfield, Surrey. The building is significant as it is the first purpose-built childhood epilepsy centre for assessment, treatment and research in the UK and is set to become an international resource for paediatric epilepsy.

The awards night was held at the Cophthorne Hotel and Resort on the 11th June and the awards were presented by Graham Lee and BBC London weathergirl Wendy Hyrrell.

The LABC South East Building Excellence Awards recognise and reward the best quality design construction and project management in the South East. The quality stems from good design and an efficient design team, and is translated into quality buildings by an effective construction team.
