## Lee Evans Partnership wins national planning award 06.02.11

Lee Evans Partnership's development Bradbury Court, at East Clayton Farm in Sussex has just won the award for equality and diversity at the national Royal Town Planning Institute's (RTPI) Planning Awards 2010. This follows the project's earlier success in the RTPI regional awards where it was first in its category and named as overall joint winner.

The 2010 RTPI Planning Awards was held on Thursday, 3rd February at the London Hilton Hotel, Park Lane and the awards are recognised as a benchmark of excellence to encourage best practice and reward outstanding achievement.

In his message, RTPI President, Richard Summers praised this year's winning schemes: 'The results showcase exemplary plans and projects that will inspire current and future planners and demonstrate to everyone, from ministers to businesspeople and local residents, that spatial planning is essential to sustainable development.'

Bradbury Court, which was also a Pinders Healthcare Design Award Winner in 2010, is a self-contained development of eight living units created from a range of farm buildings for occupation by young people with multiple disabilities, set in the South Downs national park.

The judges were especially impressed by the relaxed friendly atmosphere in which the residents lived and praised the development for its high standard of communal facilities and as an exceptional example of planning for modern living.
